COFA Migrants* are generally ineligible for FEMA assistance, but if you have a U.S. citizen child or household member you may be eligible.

*COFA Migrants are people from the Federated States of Micronesia, Palau or the Republic of the Marshall Islands, who came to the U.S. to live and work pursuant to the Compacts of Free Association.

If you're not eligible for FEMA:

The American Red Cross (1-800-733-2767) and
 the Salvation Army (671-472-7671) do not have citizenship requirements for their assistance

Distribution of **food**, **water** and **other essential supplies** may still be available at your mayor's office

Ask your friends, neighbors and local nonprofits for help - someone in your community might have the resources or skills to help you rebuild!



To recap:

COFA Migrants are not eligible for FEMA
 benefits but if one person in the household is eligible, you can still get FEMA benefits

Apply as a co-registrant with the eligible
member of your household - no matter how young they are

Be completely honest in your FEMA application - it is a crime to lie to FEMA!
